Professional Background

Rob Burrus became Dean of the Cameron School of Business in July, 2015. Dr. Burrus joined the UNCW faculty in 1998. (Prior to UNCW, he was a Visiting Assistant Professor at Kenyon College from 1996 to 1998.)
